

Nicholas Berliner currently serves as Special Assistant to the President and Senior Director for Russia and Central Asia at the National Security Council. He previously served as Deputy Assistant Secretary of State in the State Department's Bureau of European and Eurasian Affairs, where he was responsible for Russia, as well as non-proliferation, security assistance, and arms control.

Nicholas has held numerous positions focused on Europe and Eurasia over the course of his diplomatic career. He served as Deputy Chief of Mission at the U.S. Embassy to the Kingdom of Belgium in Brussels, where he was also Chargé d'affaires from 2021 to 2022. He was the Director of the Office of Russian Affairs at the Department of State from 2017 to 2019 and Deputy Chief of Mission at the U.S. Embassy in Tbilisi, Georgia from 2014 to 2017. Other assignments include Director for Central Asian Affairs at the National Security Council; Deputy Economic Counselor at the U.S. Embassy in Kabul, Afghanistan; and Political and Economic Counselor at the U.S. Embassy in Tashkent, Uzbekistan, as well as assignments at the U.S. Embassies in Croatia, Russia, and the U.S. Mission to NATO in Brussels.

Nicholas holds a Master's Degree from Georgetown University and speaks Russian, Croatian, Spanish and French. He is married and has three children.
